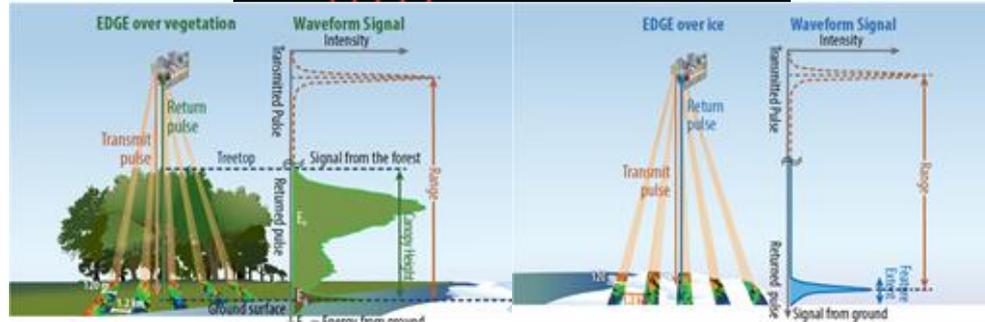
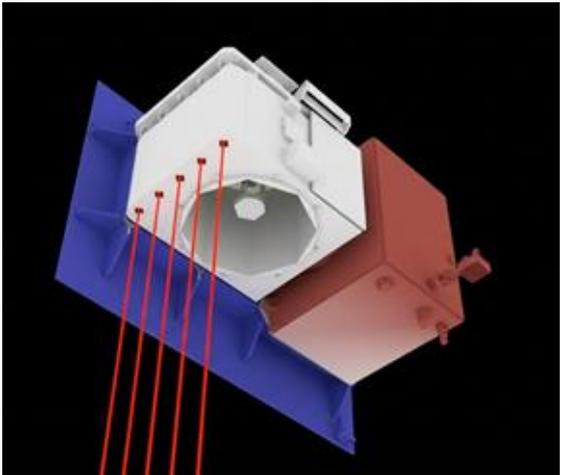


UMD to Lead Satellite Mission



Six UMD researchers are part of a team that will lead NASA's new **Earth Dynamics Geodetic Explorer (EDGE)** satellite mission.

With up to **\$355M** in support, EDGE is scheduled to launch in 2030 with the goal of providing high-resolution, 3D measurements of more of the Earth's surface than ever before.

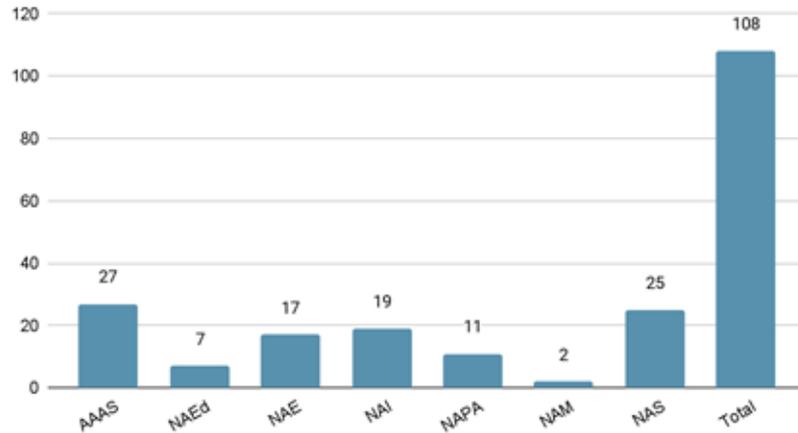

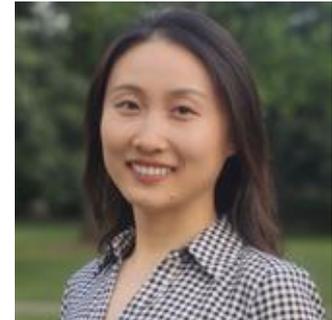

Campus Updates





In Memoriam: Elaine Johnson Coates '59

- First African American woman to receive an undergraduate degree at UMD, passed away on February 14 and celebrated at campus memorial service.
- Daughter of railroad porter and domestic worker, entered UMD at age 17. One of first seven African American undergraduates to live on UMD's campus and only one of that group to graduate four years later.
- Received honorary degree, portrait in Benjamin Building and namesake of Johnson-Whittle Hall along with the late Hiram Whittle, first African American UMD undergraduate.

Research Resilience Initiatives

Preserve, Pivot and Grow Program

- Preserve strategic institutional investments, support researchers pivoting their current portfolio, and grow research enterprise
- Track 1 (Strategic Initiatives): **7** awards of **\$2.4M** across **6** colleges
- Track 2 (At-Risk Faculty/Labs): **18** awards of **\$900K** across **8** colleges

MPOWER Early Scholars Investment Fund

- Short-term, high-impact initiative to sustain scholar pipeline and protect joint UMD-UMB research enterprise
- Track 1 (Junior TTK): **20** awards of **\$1M** across **9** colleges
- Track 2 (GA): **31** awards of **\$750K** across **7** colleges
- Track 3 (Postdoc): **6** awards of **\$225K** across **5** colleges

State Budget Update

Budget Trends

- **\$2.998B** operating budget for UMD in FY27, increasing slightly overall due to health care, pension, etc.
 - Base appropriation cut of **\$12.2M**, following reduction of **\$28M** in FY25 and **\$59M** in FY26
 - TBD funding/impact of COLA, Merit, etc. in FY27

Budget Highlights

- **\$44.3M** for new Health and Human Sciences complex
- **\$16.3M** to complete Zupnik Hall



Capital of Quantum

\$74M total in Governor's proposed FY27 budget for UMD, IonQ and University of Maryland Enterprise Corporation quantum initiatives

\$40M Capital Funding

- **\$20M** for new IonQ headquarters
- **\$20M** to renovate and equip Deep Tech facilities in Discovery District, including Microsoft Quantum Research Center

\$34M Operating Funding

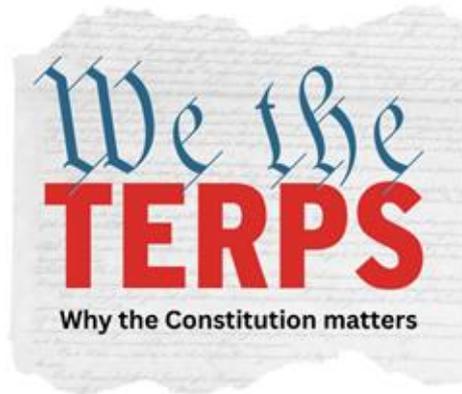
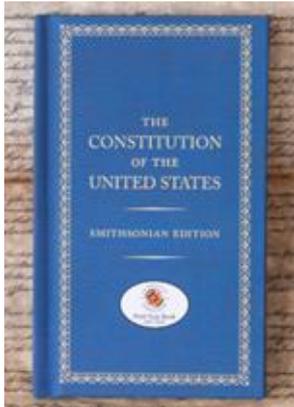
- **\$20M** to expand Quantum Startup Foundry and quantum testbeds including National Quantum Lab (QLab)
- **\$7M** for faculty hiring cluster initiative
- **\$5M** for test and evaluation experts
- **\$2M** to support new testbeds, recruit and support quantum tech companies, and compete nationally

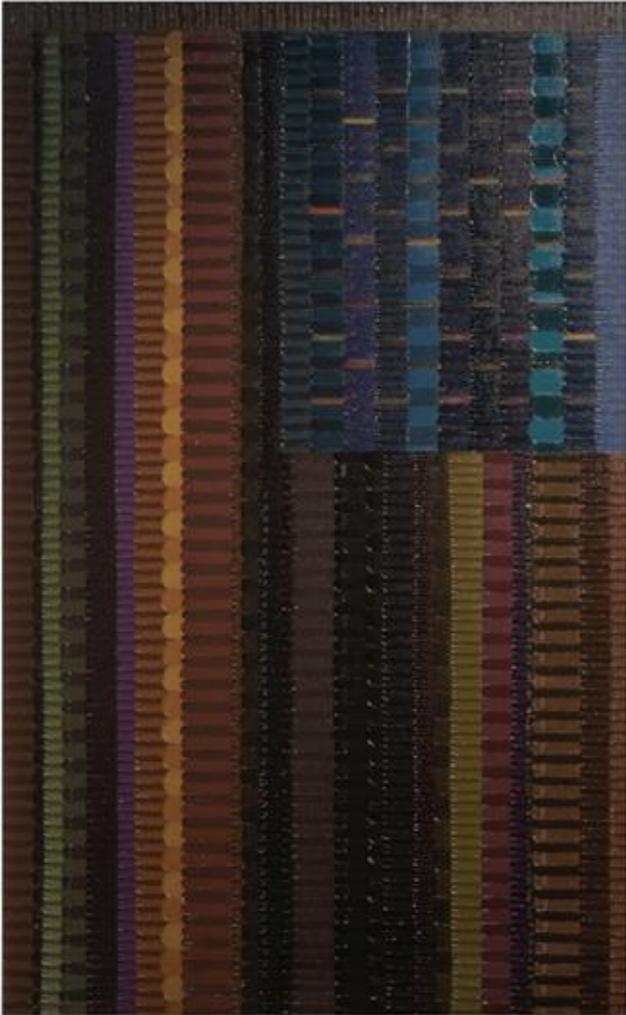

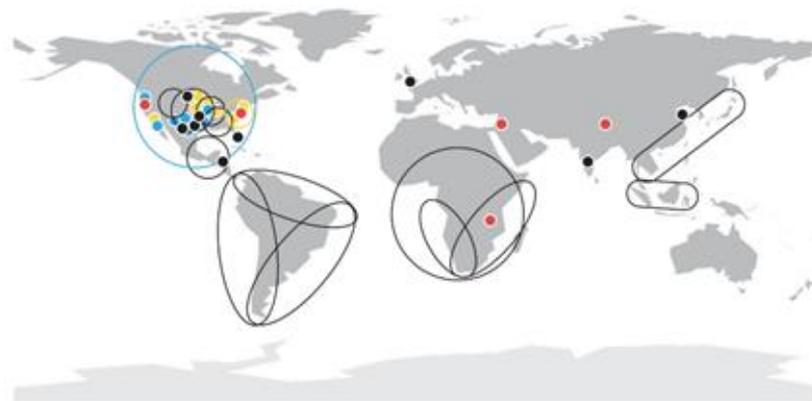

Grand Challenges Grants 2.0

- **Institutional Awards:** Up to three awards of **\$1.5M** over three years
- **Team Awards:** Up to seven awards of **\$600K** over three years
- All proposals require collaboration across multiple disciplines and must represent at least two (Team) or three (Institutional) colleges
